FROM PASTOR'S HEART

Do you know why we have the wise men as the last scene in our Drive-Thru Nativity and why they are to the left in our Nativity on the Altar? It is because January 6 is the day of Epiphany, the day the Christian church celebrates the arrival of the wise men to the child, Jesus, and give homage to the newborn King. I say "wise men," depending on the translation or the song, you might know them as wise men, Magi, sages or even kings. Usually they are described as astrologers, but the term used in the Greek New Testament implies an interest in dreams, stars, and perhaps even magic. They were from the East, presumably the area Babylon, the region where the Israelites had been taken into captivity 700 years earlier. As to how many wise men there were, we simply don't know. Traditionally, the story says there were three men based on the three gifts they offered: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Gold, you know: a very expensive, precious metal, useful for the buying and selling of goods. You're probably less familiar with the other two gifts. Frankincense is a tree resin that can be either dried into granules for burning or infused into an oil. Myrrh is a spice, either dry or added to oils to be used for both perfume and for anointing. Gifts from kings; gifts fit for a king.

What gifts are you giving to Jesus this year? What kind of gifts have you brought that are worthy for the Newborn King? It's tempting to tap our wallets and checkbooks, thinking we bring Jesus our gifts of finances. How about our prayers and our praises? That's a good, sanctified answer. Perhaps we owe him good, Christian living.

He doesn't want any of those things. Jesus doesn't want you to bring to his crib your gold-plated, incense-infused, myrrh-scented self-righteous life. He doesn't want your money. He doesn't want your goodness. All Jesus wants from you is your sins, your guilt, and your shame. That sounds backwards, doesn't it? Why, the Wise Men brought gifts fit for a King (gold, frankincense, and myrrh) shouldn't we at least try to do the same, give him our best?

If Jesus were an earthly King, an earthly ruler, then yes, this might be true. But Jesus is a different kind of King. The perfect, holy, sinless Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, announced by angels, witnessed by shepherds, whose name is Jesus, is a King who will save his people from their sins. This is the only gift Jesus wants from you this Epiphany: your sins, because that's the entire reason he came, to save you from those damned, I use that deliberately, and damning sins.

On this first month of the New Year, take all of the sins of the past and leave them with Jesus. Don't carry them any further. Your sins of cursing and swearing, dishonoring your parents, speaking ill of our elected officials, hating the ex, yelling at the kids, gossiping, lying, stealing time from our employers, holding grudges; of having emotional affairs, alcohol and drug abuse, failing to love, honor and cherish your spouse; failing to fear, love and trust in God more than all the other things; thinking that you can make yourself better all by yourself. There are many more, those sins you try to bury deep within, but the guilt keeps dragging them to the surface; those things you try to shove into the dark corner of your memory, but the shame (the devil's favorite lie that you should know better because you are a Christian!) keeps shining a light into those corners and illuminates them for you to remember. Of these, all of these, give them to Jesus. Bring them to the infant King in repentance, confess them, and believe that Jesus came to take them for you.

Those are the gifts that Jesus wants. You don't have to wrap them up pretty; they don't need bows and ribbons; they don't deserve pretty wrappings. Give them to Jesus with all their ugliness and nastiness.

Start the New Year fresh, free, and forgiven. Jesus gives you the gift of forgiveness, destroying sin's damning power. He gives you the gift of joy, that you are no longer burdened by the weight of your griefs and shame. Jesus gives you the gift of peace, that the relationship with God is restored and whole. Jesus gives you the gift of salvation, that eternity with God is yours. Jesus gives the gift of love, that you are able to share with those around you. Jesus gives the gift of faith that enables you to say, "This is most certainly true." As 2022 starts to pass away in our rear-view mirror, and as 2023 stands before us, I rejoice in the blessings of God given to Holy Cross in the year past and look forward to what is to come in the months ahead.

God grant you his peace and joy in abundance.

11th Annual Three Days of Prayer January 3-5, 2023

Prayer was a holy habit practiced by Jesus Himself (see Mark 1:35; Luke 11:1). The disciples who walked alongside Him witnessed a connection between His public life and ministry, and this habit of prayer. It was a connection so significant, that they asked Jesus to teach them to pray (Luke 11:1). LCMC's Three Days of Prayer is an opportunity for us to follow the Lord's example and to come together as one across the association with a shared purpose: to pray. Following are some suggested points of emphasis for each of the three days. These are not only things to be prayed for, of course, but they can be points of daily emphasis that bring us all together as one in prayer.

DAY ONE

Pray for our Congregations and Leaders

"Lord, we pray that You bless our congregations and leaders with your favor and with Your provision to carry out the ministry and mission You have in store for us. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen."

What can God do through almost 1,000 LCMC congregations in the United States and overseas? Wouldn't it be wonderful if our testimony in the years to come, is that God was at work in and through our association, drawing millions of people to faith in Jesus as Savior and Lord? This is what can happen as the Holy Spirit empowers us to live lives of witness (Acts 1:8), serve as ambassadors for the kingdom of God who have a message of life to proclaim (2 Corinthians 5:20) and God-stories to share (1 Peter 3:15).

DAY TWO

Pray for those who don't yet know Jesus as Savior and Lord, and for the Prodigals

"Lord, give us Your heart for those who don't yet know you as Savior and Lord, and for the prodigals. Create in us a boldness to love them and serve them and to share our God-stories with them as opportunities arise. Open our eyes to be aware of everyday encounters in which we can minister Your love and Your power to those in need. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen."

Our Lord Jesus came to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:10). And we know that our Heavenly Father is a father who joyfully welcomes home the prodigals. Let us pray that God will bring us together as one and


the Lord might bring home the prodigals who have walked away from a life of faith with Him. Let us pray that God might set them free from any woundedness or deception that has driven them away from their relationship with Him and they might experience God's love and acceptance and affirmation as His beloved sons and daughters.

DAY THREE

Pray for our International Partners

"Thank You, Lord, that you have bound us together with these sister churches and leaders and partner networks. We pray that You will give them protection and provision. We pray that You will show us how we can come alongside them, encourage them, and serve with them. Lord, grant our brothers and sisters Your favor in their cities, communities, and countries.. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen."

It is with and through our international partners that we are being empowered by God to live out this reality of being witnesses of what God has done in and through the life, death, and resurrection of His Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is with and through our international partners we are enabled by God to live these lives of witness locally, regionally, and throughout entire countries.



HELPFUL HINTS FOR MAKING CHRISTIAN RESOLUTIONS

New Year resolutions usually deal with the physical instead of the spiritual. Following are ideas to help you set spiritual goals.

- * **READ YOUR BIBLE MORE.** If you need help choosing a translation, please speak with Pastor Wenzel. He'll be happy to help you find the one that's best for you.
- * **START PRAYER JOURNALING.** This could include things like Bible verses that are important to you; writing what is on your heart; list what you are thankful for; find at least one good thing that happened each day; remember prayers that He answered; etc.
- * **PLAY BIBLE GAMES.** Many Bible trivia and quiz games can be found online.
- * **READ DAILY DEVOTIONALS.** Portals of Prayer are available from the church office in three sizes.
- * **LISTEN TO PRAISE AND WORSHIP MUSIC.** Where is the dial set on your car radio? Even as background music, it will help your mind stay where it should.
- * **WATCH CLEAN MOVIES.** They're hard to find but they are out there.

- * **REPRESENT YOUR FAITH BY THE WAY YOU DRESS.** Dressing modestly and respecting ourselves shows we treat our body as the temple of the Holy Spirit that it is.
- * **TITHE.** The more you trust God with your finances, the more He will bless you. Even when your budget makes it seem like it's impossible, it somehow works out even with money given to the church.
- * **ATTEND CHURCH REGULARLY.** It's important to have regular fellowship with those of faith. They not only offer support but can also offer accountability and opportunities for service.
- * **EVALUATE SIN IN YOUR LIFE.** It's there but you've probably become numb to it. Look closely at your habits and see where improvement can be made.
- * **BE THE CHANGE.** If you want to see more love, show more love yourself. Be the example that people around you begin to follow.

Time to Connect with Jesus and One Another

It is that time of year again! As we ring in 2023 full of hope and anticipation, many will make New Year's resolutions, resolving to improve one's life by committing to new healthy habits. While diet and exercise are the most common and talked about, resolve this time of year is often ambitious and can touch many other aspects of life, including spiritual things. While it is true that we have retreat programs led by some fabulous guest leaders, the real leader is the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

When the people of God come together for some intentional time away, God always shows up. We learn, we laugh, we love and are loved. As a voluntary association of churches, our strength and gift is most evident when we take the time to connect with one another. In our intentional time away with God and others we both give and receive blessing. And God strengthens and renews each one of us for the difficult journeys of discipleship that surely await us when we return to our regularly scheduled lives in our own communities.


